

SHROVE TUESDAY (PANCAKE TUESDAY)

Shrove Tuesday is the day before Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent in the Roman Catholic Church. It is a day of celebration as well as penitence. *Shrove* is the past tense of the word *shrive*, which means to hear a confession, assign penance, and absolve from sin. In the Middle Ages, especially in Northern Europe and England, it became the custom to confess one's sins on the day before Lent began in order to enter the penitential season in the right spirit.



Lent is a time of fasting and abstinence, of giving things up. In the old days there were many foods that observant Christians would not eat during Lent: foods such as meat and fish, fats, eggs, and milky foods. So that no food was wasted, families would have a feast on the shroving Tuesday, and eat up all the foods that wouldn't last the forty days of Lent. The need to eat up the fats gave rise to the French name Mardi Gras; meaning fat Tuesday. Pancakes became associated with Shrove Tuesday as they were a dish that could use up all the eggs, fats and milk in the house with just the addition of flour. Over time, Mardi Gras extended from a single day to the entire period of Shrovetide, the days from the last Sunday before Lent through Shrove Tuesday. **Come join us for PANCAKE TUESDAY, February 28, Continuous buffet from 5-7pm, OLS Parish Hall.**

ASH WEDNESDAY

A day of fasting and abstinence, Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a season of penance and reflection which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection. The distribution of ashes reminds us of our own mortality and calls us to repentance. In the early Church, Ash Wednesday was the day on which those who had sinned, and who wished to be readmitted to the Church, would begin their public penance. The ashes that we receive are a reminder of our own sinfulness and help us develop a spirit of humility and sacrifice.

Here at OLS, **ashes will be distributed on Wednesday, March 1st at the 9:00am, (1:15pm school Mass) & 7:30pm Masses.** Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are Days of *Fasting and Abstinence*. *Fasting:* (ages 18-59) either bread and water only OR a vegetarian diet OR only one complete meal. *Abstinence:* (Ages 14+) no meat or another favorite food and moderation in all food and drink. Fasting and abstinence is not simply a form of penance, however; it is also a call for us to take stock of our spiritual lives. As Lent begins, we should set specific spiritual goals we would like to reach before Easter and decide how we will pursue them—for instance, by going to daily Mass when we can and receiving the Sacrament of Confession more often.
